The FY 2014 Consolidated Appropriations Act changed the definition of extremely low-income to be the greater of 30/50<sup>th</sup> (60 percent) of the Section 8 very low income limit or the poverty guideline as established by the <u>Department of Health and Human Services (HHS)</u> provided that this amount is not greater than the Section 8 50% very low-income limit. Consequently extremely low-income limits may equal the very low (50%) income limits.

Income Limit areas are based on Fair Market Rent (FMR) areas. You can determine what the Fair Market Rent is for your area at:
